

# **Playwrights Note**

**Sharon King-Campbell** 



In 2019, when I applied to do my PhD, I wanted to write on the process of collaboration in creating new works for the theatre. By the time I started the program in the fall of 2020, the world had changed in a way I would never have predicted. I did my coursework sitting on the floor in my living room, with a just-long-enough ethernet cable stretched from my laptop to my modem because none of the technology in my home was built to handle Zoom. 2 months in, I had shifted my focus – how could I not? – to the impact of COVID-19 protocols on the live theatre experience.

But there is no shifting away from collaboration when you're working in the theatre. The script you are about to hear is built out of the words of my colleagues, the theatre workers who did an interview with me and who have generously allowed me to name them: Geoff Adams, Bruce Brenton, Gaylene Buckle, Donna Butt, Ann Connors, Azal Dosanjh, Mike Hammond, Willow Kean, Brian Kenny, Amanda

Klein, Crystal Laffoley, Paul Power, Alix Reynolds, Nicole Rousseau, Jamie Skidmore, and Bernardine Stapleton.

I have supplemented their perspectives with my own words, occasionally written for this play, but mostly drawn from these interviews and from my own writings from "the early days" (up to January 2021). What you are about to see is so much more than the written-down words: the work of the incredible, enthusiastic, give-it-your-whole-self artists assembled for this project by Power Productions.

"The collaboration between work and audience [is] the final, and arguably most important, collaboration in the process," I wrote in my PhD application, and that, at least, is still true. Thank you for collaborating on this piece of theatre with us.

## **Sharon King-Campbell**



Sharon King-Campbell is an artist and scholar with a passion for the connective and change-making power of theatre. She has performed and directed for companies across Ktaqmkuk (Newfoundland), including Artistic Fraud of Newfoundland, Best Kind Productions, New Curtain Theatre, PerSIStence Theatre, Grand Bank Regional Theatre, Stephenville Theatre Festival, Girl Power Inc. and Power Productions. Sharon is Artistic Director of Shakespeare by the Sea Festival, and Producer with Kittiwake Dance Theatre. She is an award-winning writer with two published books: a collection of poetry, *This Is How It Is* (2021) and a play, *Dayboil* (2024). Her other plays include *Fighting Fire* 

with Snow (World's End Theatre), Give Me Back (skc originals/FTLOL), Original (skc originals/PerSIStence), and Melody and the Fishes (Salt Teeth). Sharon holds a BFA Theatre and a MA English from Memorial University of Newfoundland, and is currently pursuing her PhD.

#### **Paul David Power**



Paul David Power has spent the past 30 years working as a writer, playwright, actor and director. His formal training includes holding a BA in English with a concentration in theatre and a BAA in Journalism.

His leadership positions include President of the Liffey Players Drama Society in Calgary AB for three years, Artistic Director for Hubcity Theatre in Moncton NB for five years and Artistic Associate for the Shakespeare by the Sea Festival in St. John's NL for two years along with his current role as founder and Artistic Director for Power Productions.

(NAX), Song Seekers, Remnants* (White Rooster), *Alice and Other Wonderlands* (Kittiwake Dance Co.), and *Be More Chill* (Best Kind Productions), Light Design for *The Strange Case of Madame D* (RCAT/Wreckhouse Theatre), and *Drinking Again* (NAX), and Sound Design for *Men of Misfortune* (RCAT), *Heaters, Be More Chill, Fun Home, Impresario, Next to Normal, 13: The Musical, Urinetown: The Musical, and Avenue Q* (Best Kind Productions).
